
7 Anti-Stupidity Tactics to Help Couples Stay Together By Dr. Atiya K Senegal

Seven (7) Anti-Stupidity Tactics to Help Couples Stay Together

- 3. Be mindful of your conversations and interactions with others, especially those of the opposite gender so as not to cause confusion or lend someone to misread your intentions.
